our years ago Middle Fork River Forest Preserve was designated an International Dark Sky Park by the International Dark Sky Association due to its exceptionally high quality starry nights and a nocturnal environment that is protected for its scientific, natural, educational, and cultural heritage, as well as its public enjoyment. At the time it was one of 72 parks worldwide to hold that designation and the only one

Now, it's still the only Dark Sky Park in Illinois, and the Champaign County Forest Preserve District (CCFPD) is making improvements that will enhance the dark sky viewing experience in the preserve. CCFPD received an Open Space Land Acquisition and Development (OSLAD) from the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) in September 2022 to support the construction of a dark sky trail and supporting amenities at Middle Fork River Forest Preserve.

The trail will improve accessibility at Middle Fork by providing new, ADA-compliant campsites, paved trails, and accessible seating. The existing campground at Middle Fork has been a popular destination. Nearly every weekend, all sites are fully booked.

The project will not only appeal to dark sky viewers, but will be popular among regular patrons of the Middle Fork River Forest Preserve. The trail will loop through the tall grass prairie at the preserve offering new educational and recreational opportunities. The nature

playground will be a draw for campers and families visiting the preserve and the expanded campground will alleviate our peak demand issues and prevent the District from turning away campers.

The Forest Preserve Friends Foundation needs donations to help accomplish this goal. On Giving Tuesday, November 29, we will be raising funds for

the construction of the Dark Sky Trail. Gifts from visitors like you have made so many projects a reality - the new roof on the Covered Bridge, the Willow Pond renovation, and numerous prairie restoration efforts. 

Botanical Garden to get a **new** greenhouse



In 2023, CCFPD will be starting a new and exciting project at the Lake of the Woods Forest Preserve, the Discovery Garden Greenhouse. The space will feature improved garden areas and an indoor greenhouse conservatory for both public strolling and scheduled programs.

The existing greenhouse shows its age at over 50 years old. Staff see this project as an opportunity to replace an old, inefficient building with something more engaging and energyefficient. One of the goals for the new design is to provide a

> more interactive educational space where people can learn about the natural world both on their own time and through the many classes and activities the District offers. Unlike the existing facility, the new greenhouse will be fully ADA-accessible and have conveniently located public restrooms. The project will also support the Mabery Gelvin Botanical Garden with added greenhouse production space.

Staff are excited by how the new design will help unify the Museum of the Grand Prairie, Mabery Gelvin Botanical Garden, and Discovery Garden into a more connected and vibrant environment. Construction is expected to start in early 2023.
